

GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR THE 3RD DIVISION RESEARCH PARLIAMENT

I. RATIONALE

Relative to DepEd Order No. 16, s. 2017, otherwise known as the Research Management Guidelines (RMG) that aim to promote the culture of research and to improve support mechanisms for research such as funding, partnerships, capacity building, funding-source mechanisms, and link of research to education process through research dissemination, utilization, and advocacy respectively, our division remained steadfast in the promotion of culture of research and upholds policy formulation based on research results.

To promote an environment of evidence-based decision-making and policy development, SDO Biñan City has made stride in instituting research and its utilization in policy and program development. DO No. 13, s. 2015 established a systematic policy development process in the Department, promoting evidence-based policy formulation supported by research studies.

The 3rd Division Research Parliament will be held on November 24, 2023, with the theme: "**Synergy, Innovation, and Collaboration**". This activity aims to: (a) provide a platform for outstanding research to be disseminated and utilized by public; (b) provide an avenue to researchers to share their research findings that are aligned with MATATAG Agenda, Basic Education Research Agenda (BERA), Division Education Development Plan, and School Improvement Plan (SIP); (c) give recognition on the accomplished research initiatives; (d) synthesize research findings and recommendations for policy review and program enhancement; and (e) share significant experiences, best practices, and challenges towards the conduct of research.

II. RESEARCH PRESENTATION

Procedure of Presentation

1. Participants shall use the official slide deck of the Division.
2. Participants will be given **5 minutes only** to present a concise but complete summary of research findings. Presentation must not include the full paper but a summary of study.
3. After the presentation, 5 minutes will be allotted for feedbacking and comments from the panel members to further improve the research paper. Due to time constraints, maximum of 3 questions shall be asked by the panel.
4. Participants shall use the following as guide for the sequence of slide presentation:

IV. Definition of Terms

Teaching Personnel-this refers to teaching personnel from pre-elementary, elementary, secondary education, alternative education, Madrasah, technical-vocational, and special education (DepEd Order No. 77 s. 2010).

Non-Teaching Personnel-this includes nurses, accountant, engineer, librarian, dentist, budget officer, registrar, supply officer, planning officer, project development officer, bookkeeper, disbursing officer, cashier, administrative officer, records officer, medical officer (DepEd GMIS and BHROD Classification as of February 15, 2021).

Teaching-Related Personnel-this includes Chief Education Program Specialist, Senior Education Program Specialist, Education Program Supervisor, Public Schools District Supervisor, Guidance Teacher/Coordinator (DepEd GMIS and BHROD Classification as of February 15, 2021).

V. Eligibility Requirements

Individual Category

1. Regular/Permanent teaching, non-teaching, teaching related personnel of the City Schools Division of Biñan City.
2. Has completed and presented action/basic research in the 8th cycle (2023). Research shall be submitted to the Division office and is included in the official list of researchers for the 8th cycle.
3. Must not be on leave at the time of the search/parliament.
4. Has not been subjected to any form of disciplinary actions.

School Category

1. The school with the greatest number of completed research shall be based on the number of completed research during the 8th Cycle (2023).

2. The outstanding research program shall refer to completed research initiative from SY 2022-2023.

Special Category

1. The research program implementer shall refer to the School Research Coordinator of the school which is awarded with outstanding research program in the school category.
2. The outstanding research program completion report shall be based on the submitted 1-page magazine type completion report by the School Research Coordinator.
